Having regular and open conversations with your child about their use of technology and the internet is the best way to stay up to date, not only with changes in the online world, but also with what they are doing and seeing online.

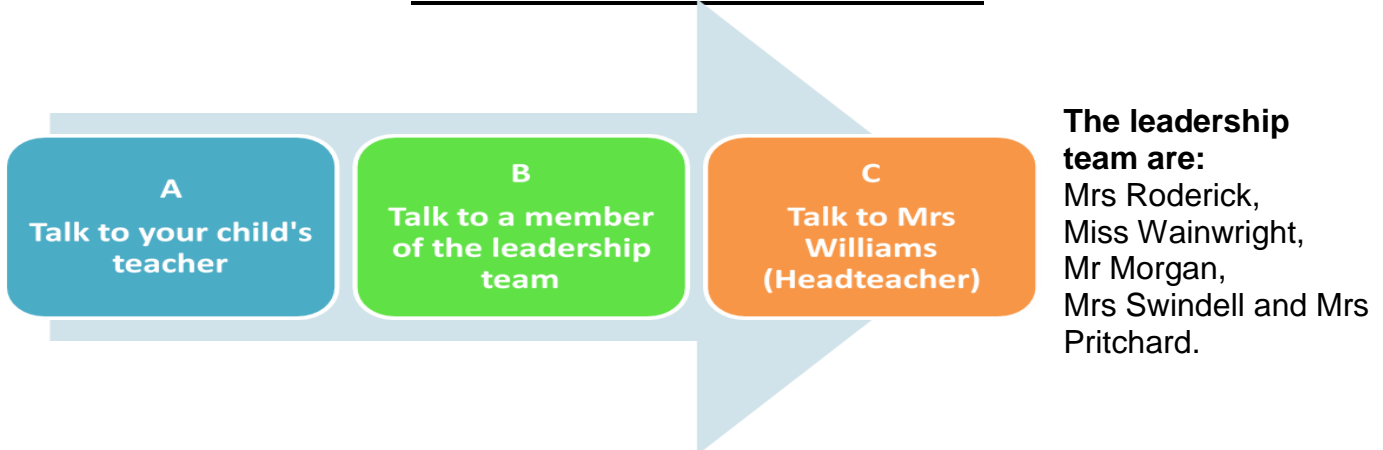
### Manage influence by researching the content and games your child enjoys the most
