## Safety at the School Gates

Please can I ask all of our families who are dropping children off in the morning, by car, to consider the congestion outside the school gates.

The road outside the school site can be very busy at drop off. The road markings around the school are there to keep everyone safe. If dropping off, or picking up at the end of the day, please avoid parking or idling on these markings and be vigilant to the children crossing the roads. There have been some very close calls this week, with children running in between parked cars; not seeing the moving cars in their path.
