

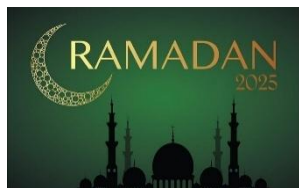

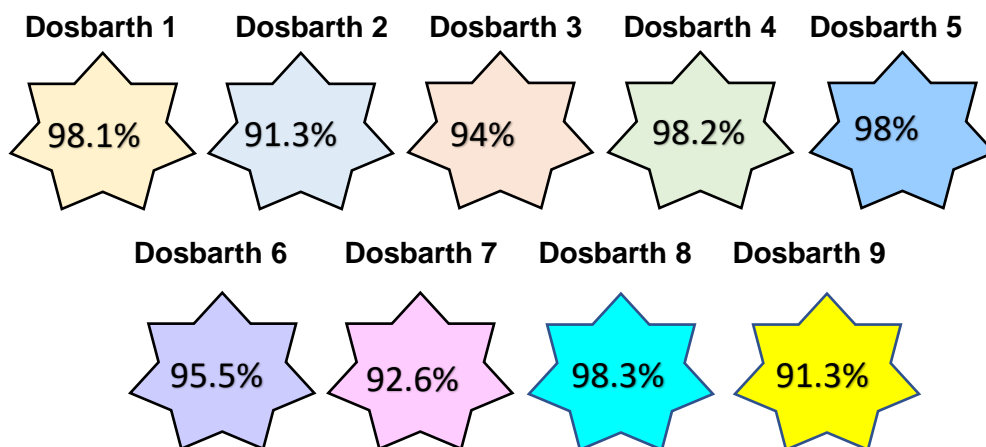

## Managing Head Injuries at Radnor Primary School

Please see below the procedures the school will follow for managing bumped head injuries.


### **Minor bump to head**

<p>A minor bump to the head is common in children, particularly those of infant school age. If a child is asymptomatic: No bruising, swelling, abrasion, mark of any kind, dizziness, headache, nausea or vomiting. The child appears well, then the incident will be treated as a “bump” rather than a “head injury”.</p>	<p><b>Action to be taken:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Child to be assessed by a First Aider</li><li>● Apply cold compress</li><li>● Complete first aid record with details of incident</li><li>● Bumped Head sticker given</li><li>● Report to Teacher/adult in class</li><li>● Parent MUST be spoken to at the end of the day, first aid slip given to them.</li></ul>
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### **Minor head injury – no loss of consciousness**

<p>A minor head injury often causes bumps, swellings or bruises on the exterior of the head.</p> <p>Other symptoms:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Nausea</li><li>● Mild headache</li><li>● Tender bruising or mild swelling of the scalp</li><li>● Mild dizziness</li></ul>	<p><b>Action to be taken:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Child to be assessed by a First Aider</li><li>● Apply cold compress</li><li>● Complete first aid record with details of incident</li><li>● Bumped Head sticker given</li><li>● Observation</li><li>● No P.E/physical activities</li><li>● Report to Teacher/adult in class</li><li>● Parent informed by phone call straight away. If parents wish to come and assess for themselves that option is to be given.</li><li>● Parent must be spoken to at the end of the day and first aid slip MUST be given to them</li></ul>
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### **Severe head injury – loss of consciousness**

<p><b>Action to be taken:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● If there is a neck injury and child is unconscious DO NOT move child</li><li>● Call 999 and ask for AMBULANCE from first aid mobile phone in first aid room (to be arranged)</li><li>● Contact Parent immediately</li><li>● Inform Head teacher</li><li>● Member of SLT and First Aider to be with child at all times.</li><li>● Complete First aid record</li></ul>	 <p>Mr. Bump</p>
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## School Essentials Grant – Not Just Free School Meals

You could receive a grant of £125 per child if they attend primary school or are in years 8, 9, 10, or 11. As the applying parent or guardian, you must be receiving one of the following:

- Income Support,
- Jobseeker's Allowance (income based),
- Employment Support Allowance (income related),
- Child Tax Credit, with a household income of £16,190 or less,
- Pension Credit (guarantee element), or
- Universal Credit with net household earnings of less than £7,400.



If you receive Working Tax Credit you will not be entitled to the grant. If you meet these criteria, please complete the School Essentials Grant application form.
