Our creative spirit, our team work and our agreed vision will allow us to help you all become happy, healthy, independent young people!

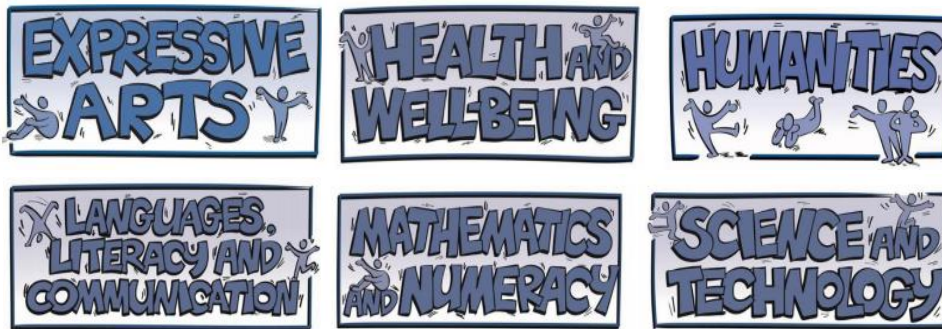
At Radnor we aim to:

Within these topics, the six **Areas of Learning and Experience** are covered to make sure that everyone experiences and develops real life learning.



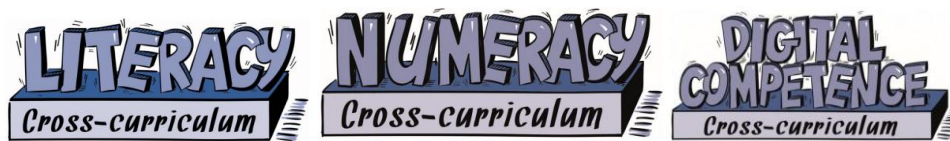
Our aim is that all learners develop the skills in the **Four Core Purposes.**
