Thank you to all our families who joined us today for our first community bike bus.



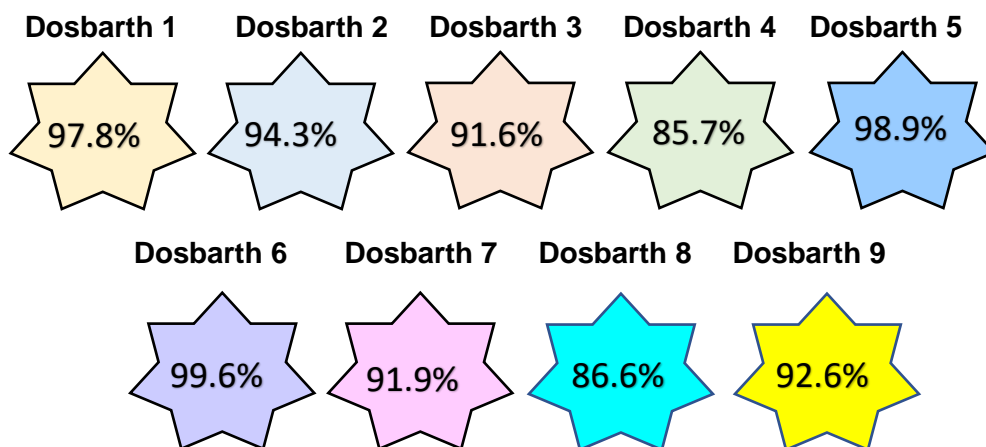

School Essentials Grant – Not Just Free School Meals

You could receive a grant of £125 per child if they attend primary school or are in years 8, 9, 10, or 11. As the applying parent or guardian, you must be receiving one of the following:

- Income Support,
- Jobseeker's Allowance (income based),
- Employment Support Allowance (income related),
- Child Tax Credit, with a household income of £16,190 or less,
- Pension Credit (guarantee element), or
- Universal Credit with net household earnings of less than £7,400.

If you receive Working Tax Credit you will not be entitled to the grant. If you meet these criteria, please complete the School Essentials Grant application form.

Who loves to read? Class 4 do! **Dwlu ar ddarllen**

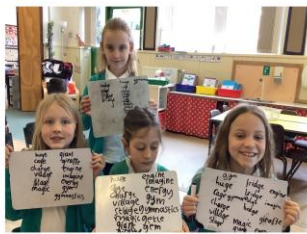
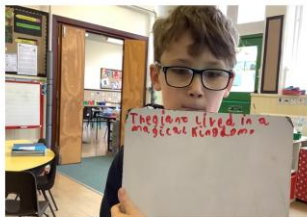

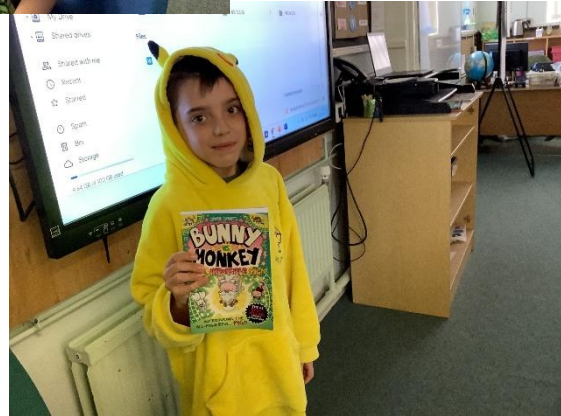
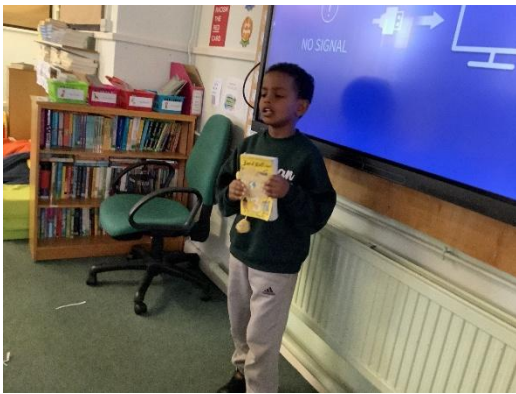
One Planet Topic
