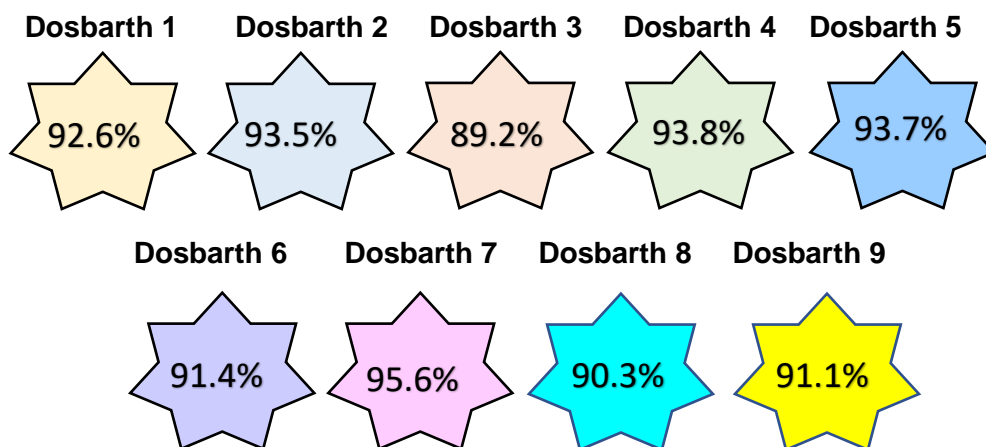

Dosbarth 8 have had another busy term and have thoroughly enjoyed working and learning together. We have worked on two interesting topics and learnt lots!

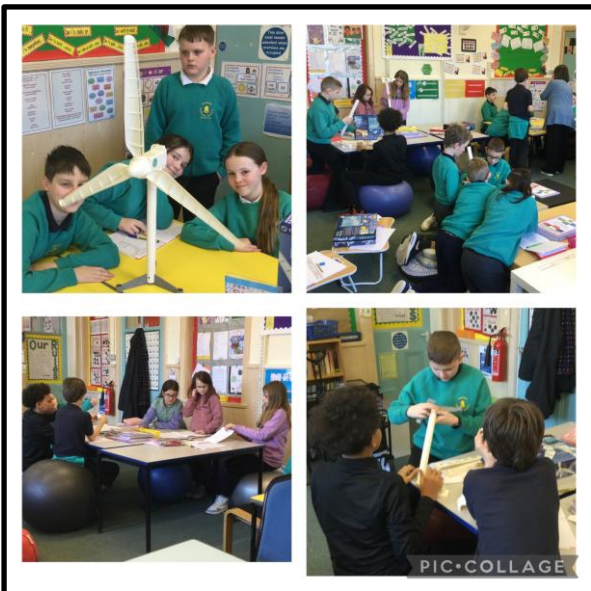
In this newsletter you'll find a taste of what we've been up to!

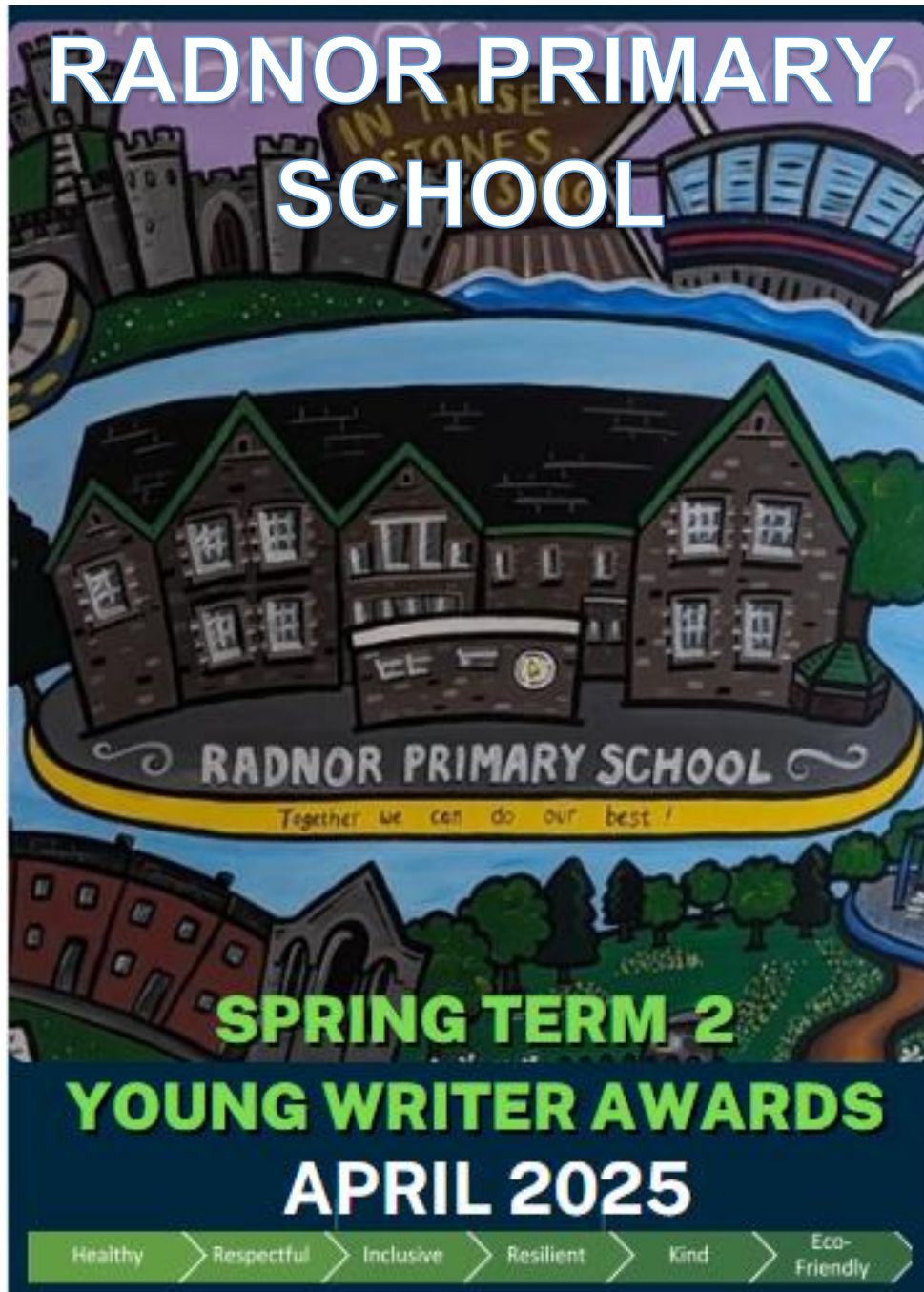
Year 6 spent a busy few days in glorious Llangrannog where thankfully the sun was shining and we had lots of fun!

Some Fishy Chaos

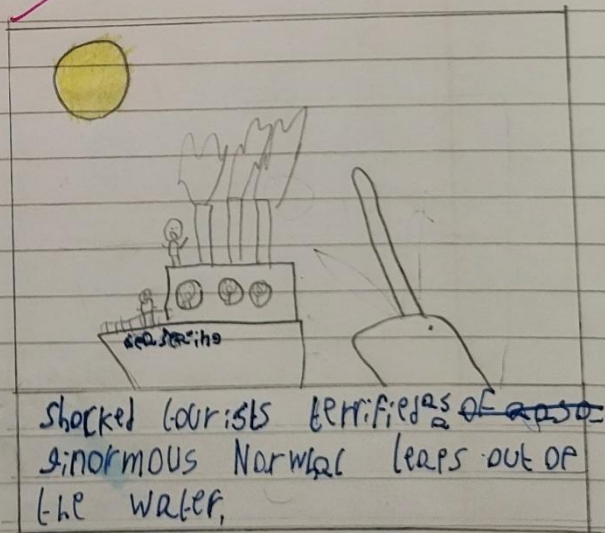

How have giant tortoises adapted?

Amazing adaption

Adaption is a significant part of how the creatures react to their climate. Adapting means evolving (changing). This is an enormous part of the environment and is a special part of life. If not for adaptation the variations of animals would not all be here today. Adaptation has enabled a better chance of survival. If it was not for these incredible creatures adapting and having new unique ways of living they would not thrive there. This explanation text will show you how giant tortoises have evolved through the ages.

Strong shells

Some of these magnificent giant tortoises have evolved to have a saddle-shaped shell. In fact these tortoises' shells look like a saddle. If giant tortoises were not to have been born with a strong and sturdy shell they would struggle. These shells help their necks to reach more vegetation, and get more food. Their shells are the opposite of weak, they are hard. As their necks are able to stretch to more food it gives them a better chance of survival.

Legendary legs and supportive skin

These lovely creatures have got great mobility with their super strong legs. Their legs have adjusted to be able to get across the rough and bumpy terrain. Their super, supportive skin protects them, and keeps them safe from the prickly plants like cacti. This gives them a better chance of survival, this provides more opportunity for: food, water, protection and shelter.

Sense of surrounding

Giant tortoises have incredible vision — they can see nearly all their predators coming from a far distance. When giant tortoises sense a competitor it will hide in its shell. If giant tortoises were not to have a secure, strong and sturdy shell they would find it hard to thrive there. They have an excellent solid shell. When they see a creature that is more of a threat they will use their stamina to run.

Super solitary

These great creatures are generally solitary (alone). They do not trek in groups, as there is severe competition for their fantastic food. They find it much of a struggle and a risk to travel in herds or small groups. If these marvellous creatures travelled in groups they would be at a major disadvantage to survive. This is a truly fascinating example of adaptation.

Our fearful future

In conclusion this special species has adapted in a unique and unusual way, however this species is in danger. Humans have harmed these animals by: putting animals that eat the same vegetation in their habitat, or by destroying their home. If we keep doing this, these extraordinary creatures will sadly perish

Incredible Iguanas

Awesome Adaptation

Animals thrive all around the world in a lot of different environments, because they have managed to change over time. This change is known as adaptation: it is an alteration in the animal's body or behavior which supports its survival. There are various elements to consider for survival: food, weather conditions and any predators. One such animal that can thrive in difficult conditions is the exotic iguana. In this text I will be talking about interesting iguanas.

Tremendous Tail

The tail of an impressive iguana is amazing: it is extremely sharp which they use as a sword-whip to drive off predators or enemies. If the enemy grabs the tail or it gets stuck the incredible iguana can detach the tail and run away (it is also fantastic that the tail will regrow a short while after).

Smart Skin

There is a really clever reason for why iguanas have green and brown skin. An iguana can camouflage nearly anywhere: with such skin as green and brown the iguana can easily blend in with dirt and grass which helps them sneak up on their bounties and hide from predators.

Handy Habitat

Impressive iguanas decide to live near water for a really surprising reason: in case the creature (the iguana) is hunted or a predator/enemy is close, the iguana can evacuate to the water with ease, and swim away from the action. If the iguana were not to live nearby water it would be in grave danger while being a predator's target.

Jazzy Jumper

Incredible iguanas have a great gift; they are capable of surviving a jump from 40 feet (12.192 meters) or less. In-case the iguana is in danger it has a chance to escape; the iguana can jump off a high place and survive: for most predators this jump is unsurvivable which makes it unfollowable in most conditions. In my opinion this is extremely important for a higher chance of survival for iguanas, since iguanas are near extinction.

Clever Conclusion

Imagine an iguana who doesn't have a sharp and regrowable tail, who hasn't got camouflage skin, who can't survive a fall from a high place: that is an iguana who hasn't adapted. These adaptations are vital, without them these majestic creatures would perish with no chance of survival. We must hope that these pawsome animals get through and survive.
