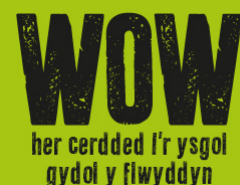
WOW Tracker

At Radnor we use the WOW Tracker to encourage pupils to travel actively to school.

WOW is a pupil-led initiative where children self-report how they get to school every day using the interactive WOW Travel Tracker. If they travel sustainably (walk/wheel, cycle, scoot or park and stride) three times a week for a month, they get rewarded with a badge. It's that easy!

We understand it is not always possible for pupils who live further way to walk/cycle or scoot. So also encourage the 'Two Street Stride' - where parents can park two streets away from school and walk the rest of the way with their child.

We hope this info will help you to also encourage your child to participate actively.
